

Baptism:

Upon class completion a date will be set for the Baptism.

Marriage:

The Church asks all couples, whether they are to be married here or overseas, to contact the parish 1 year in advance of their planned date of marriage. Couples are also expected to attend and complete a Marriage Preparation Course. If either party has previously gone through any form of marriage, civil or religious, the priest is not to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted.

ANYONE WHO DOES NOT LIVE IN ME

HE TRIED TO JOIN THE DISCIPLES (Acts 9:26)

There's a lot of adventure in today's first reading, isn't there? Paul, fresh from escaping death threats in Damascus, arrives in Jerusalem, where he faces suspicion from Christians and an attempted murder from some Greek-speaking Jews. Why so much drama?

Quite possibly God was using all this upheaval to "prune" Paul, to further purify him from remnants of his old life (John 15:1-3).

We are used to talking about the saints as if their holiness were a given, but that's rarely the case. For many of them, the road to holiness was as long and winding as it is for many of us. After all, we know that Paul had a strong, assertive personality.

humility doesn't always come easily!

By his own admission, Paul was "an arrogant man" before his conversion. You can imagine how some of that arrogance might still have been present as he tried to convert people. Maybe the man who had once spent his life "breathing murderous threats" against Christians still needed to learn Jesus' teaching about being poor in spirit (Acts 9:1). So it is possible that God was using the chaos Paul encountered in Jerusalem to help him examine his heart and see where he still needed to change.

Anyone who has lived more than a few decades will tell you how valuable it is to be pruned by the Lord. They probably didn't enjoy it at the time, but looking back, they could appreciate the fruit of such pruning. Come face-toface with our selfishness or arrogance or resentments can move us to turn to Jesus and ask him to purify us and set us free. So let Jesus prune you from time to time. He promises that if you do, you will bear "more fruit". You'll become more like him, just as Paul did.

RESTRICTIONS IN PLACES OF WORSHIP

The new measures have a direct impact on places of worship as part of an extended stay-at-home order, which will be in place until at least 20 May, 2021. Parishes must restrict attendance inside the church to 10 people, including priest, staff member/volunteer required to monitor capacity restrictions. Due to these measures, **public Masses must** be temporarily cancelled. Priests are asked to celebrate private Mass daily for the intentions of parishioners and for those suffering from Covid-19. The Archdiocese of Toronto strongly encourages those who are at an increased risk of COVID-19 to stay at home. Cardinal Thomas Collins, Archbishop of Toronto, continues his dispensation of the faithful's Sunday obligation at this time. We will Live-Stream Masses during the week on Monday and Friday at 9:00 a.m. and on Wednesday at 7:00 p.m. Sunday Mass will be Live-Streamed at 10:00 a.m.

Here at St. Dunstan's we are offering Communion Services every Saturday from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. and on Sundays from 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon. Please register to attend the Communion Service of your choice by going to Eventbrite.ca or through our website: stdunstanssc.archtoronnto.org if you have no access to book your Communion Service please call Jean in the parish office 416-694-2811 and she will book it for you.

POPE FRANCIS URGES CATHOLICS TO PRAY IN MAY FOR AN END TO COVID-19 PANDEMIC

Pope Francis invites Catholics and Marian Shrines around the world to dedicate the month of May to a marathon of prayer for an end to the Covid-19 pandemic. Catholics across the globe are encouraged to dedicate the Marian month



of May to praying for an end to the pandemic. The initiative, behind which the Pope has thrown his support, involves 30 Marian Shrines from various parts of the world. The Pontifical Council for Promoting the New Evangelization announced the news with a press release last week. It takes place under the theme "the whole Church was fervently praying to God", which recalls a verse in the Book of Acts (12:5)

PRAYER INITIATIVE

"The initiative will involve all Shrines of the World in a special way, so that they might encourage the faithful, families and communities to recite the Rosary to pray for an end to the pandemic". Pope Francis will open the Marian month of Prayer on May 1st with a Rosary broadcast across the Vatican Media platform. Each day will see Vatican News Broadcast the recitation of the Rosary at 6:00 p.m. Rome time from various Shrines taking part in the initiative. The Pope

will also close the initiative on May 31st with another special broadcasted Rosary.

END TO THE PANDEMIC

This year's dedication of May to pandemic related prayer recalls a similar occurrence during the first wave in March 2020 (Vatican News). Pope Francis led the world in prayer during that confusing and difficult time, celebrating a live-streamed daily Mass in the Casa Santa Maria. After more than a year, and with the world still in the grips of the pandemic, the Pope and Church around the world are once again leading the way in imploring God for an end to the suffering and loss which so many people are forced to bear (Vatican News).
