

Baptism:

Please pick-up a Baptismal Package from the parish office, read, complete and return same before registering to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. Upon class completion a date will be set for the Baptism.

Marriage:

The Church asks all couples, whether they are to be married here or overseas, to contact the parish 1 year in advance of their planned date of marriage. Couples are also expected to attend and complete a Marriage Preparation Course. If either party has previously gone through any form of marriage, civil or religious, the priest is not to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

Parents of children eligible to receive these sacraments (Grades 2 or higher for First Communion, and Grade 7 and higher for Confirmation) should be assured that, once the situation becomes clearer, they will be informed of the registration procedure.


ALL SOULS IN NOVEMBER
