

Baptism:


Second and Fourth Sunday of the Month by appointment only, after completion of a Baptismal Preparation Class. Please pick-up a Baptismal Package from the parish office, read, complete and return same before registering to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. Upon class completion a date will be set for the Baptism.

Marriage:

The Church asks all couples, whether they are to be married here or overseas, to contact the parish 1 year in advance of their planned date of marriage. Couples are also expected to attend and complete a Marriage Preparation Course. If either party has previously gone through any form of marriage, civil or religious, the priest is not to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted.

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

On the last Sunday of the liturgical year, the Church observes the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This feast celebrates our fulfilment in Christ, the centre and goal of the universe and human



history (see Saint John Paul II, *Redemptor hominis*, 1) who will renew all creation and restore the Kingdom to His Father. Then all the redeemed will rejoice in a new earth; the faithful will be freed from the corruption of sin and death, to glorify God through Christ the Lord (Eucharistic Prayer IV). This liturgical commemoration reminds us that everything has been made subject to Christ the Universal King, (1 Co 15: 25-29; Jn 5: 22-27) who will come at the end of time in His glory with the angels to judge the living and the dead. Let us enthrone Jesus in our hearts and strive to make Him King of our lives. To our Sovereign King we give our service, our praise and adoration, our thanksgiving.



SUNDAY MISSALS 2021-22

A new liturgical year will begin next Sunday,

November 28, the First Sunday of Advent. As you know, following the Second Vatican Council, the Church adopted a three- year cycle of Sunday readings from the Bible. This coming liturgical year is designated Year C



in the cycle of readings and features the Gospel of Luke. Sunday Missals are available after Mass at the Information Desk at a cost of \$5.00 each. We encourage everyone to have their own copy. The complete Mass for each Sunday with readings is found in this missal, as well as a selection of private prayers and hymns. It is ideal for those who would like to prepare for Sunday Mass by reading the scripture passages ahead of time.

FIRST COMMUNION REGISTRATION

Parents who wish their children in Grade 2 (or higher grades) to receive, for the first time, the sacraments of Penance and the Holy Eucharist during this school year, are asked to observe the following registration procedure. Letters with Registration Forms have been sent home with eligible children attending St. Dunstan's School. Letters are available from Father Jeff after Sunday Mass for parents of children in other schools. Registration and meeting for parents will take place next Sunday, November 28 following the 12:00 noon Mass. Completed Registration Forms along with a copy of the child's baptismal certificate and \$30 to cover the cost of catechetical materials should be submitted at this time. Children preparing for the sacraments, like all Catholics, should be in the habit of attending Sunday Mass regularly.



CONFIRMATION REGISTRATION

The Sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated next year on the Vigil of Pentecost, Saturday, June 2, 2022 at the 5:00 p.m. Mass. Letters with Registration Forms have been distributed to eligible students at St. Dunstan's School in Grades 7 and 8. Letters are available from Father Jeff after Sunday Mass for students in other schools or adults who wish to be confirmed. Registration and meeting for parents and candidates will take place Sunday, December 5 following the 12:00 noon Mass. Completed Registration Forms should be submitted at this meeting along with a copy of the candidate's baptismal certificate and \$20 to cover the cost of catechetical materials. Candidates should be in the habit of attending Sunday Mass regularly.


SIGN OF PEACE

The Sign of Peace which was restored to the liturgy of the Mass following the Second Vatican Council and extended as an optional rite to the faithful, has become a meaningful gesture expressing "ecclesial communion and mutual charity" before the reception of Holy Communion. "In the dioceses of Canada, the sign of peace is given by a handshake or a bow. However, it is appropriate that each person offer the sign of peace only to those who are nearest and in a sober manner" (General Instruction of the Roman Missal approved for use in Canada, 82).

During the pandemic, the shaking of hands was prohibited for obvious reasons. As we continue to adjust to the constantly changing protocols, the faithful are asked to give the sign of peace to those near them with a bow of the head and refrain from shaking hands. Shaking hands is also to be avoided when greeting others, including the priest, before or after Mass. As some are already suggesting, perhaps handshaking should continue to be avoided even after the pandemic is over, and permanently replaced by a bow as a safer option.

BLESSING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

The blessing of the Advent Wreath marking the beginning of the liturgical season of Advent will take place next



end of the ages. Advent is a season of joyful expectation. The growing light of the wreath, as the season progresses, signifies that Jesus whose birth we are commemorating is the Light of the World.

PAPAL VISIT

Following the Statement of Apology by the Catholic Bishops of Canada to the Indigenous Peoples of this Land which the bishops made on 24 September 2021 during their Plenary Assembly in which they pledged "to work with the Holy See and our Indigenous partners on the possibility of a pastoral visit by the Pope to Canada" the Vatican Press Office released the following statement on 27 October:
