"Mother of God" is Mary's greatest privilege and title. On this great feast day, may Our Lady inspire us to say our own "yes" to God and welcome the Saviour into our lives and hearts. Also, on the first day of the civil calendar, the Church observes the World Day of Peace, praying for peace among nations and an end to war and violence.
