

#### **INDIGENOUS DELEGATIONS TO ROME**

On April 1, Pope Francis concluded his meetings at the Vatican with Indigenous delegates representing First Nations, Inuit and Metis peoples, concerning the legacy of Canada's residential school system, with an apology for abuses which occurred there. The Holy Father said that listening to the experiences of the Indigenous delegates, "made me feel two things very strongly: indignation and shame. Indignation, because it is not right to accept evil and, even worse, to grow accustomed to evil, as if it were an inevitable part of the historical memory and without a commitment to learning from past mistakes, problems remain unresolved and keep coming back. We can see this these days in the case of war. The memory of the past must never be sacrificed at the altar of alleged progress.

I also feel shame. I have said this to you and now I say it again. I feel shame ~ sorrow and shame ~ for the role that a number of Catholics, particularly those with educational responsibilities, have had in all these things that wounded you, in the abuses you suffered and in the lack of respect shown for your identity, your culture and even your spiritual values. All these things are contrary to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. For the deplorable conduct of those members of the Catholic Church, I ask for God's forgiveness and I want to say to you with all my heart: I am very sorry. And I join my brothers, the Canadian bishops, in asking your pardon. Clearly, the content of the faith cannot be transmitted in a way contrary to the faith itself: Jesus taught us to welcome, love, serve and not judge; it is a frightening thing when, precisely in the name of the faith, counter-witness is rendered to the Gospel."

The papal apology adds to the apologies made by Popes John Paul II and Benedict XVI, as well as the apologies of the Bishops of every Canadian diocese which had residential schools, and every religious congregation which administered the schools, and the apology from the entire Canadian episcopate issued last September. Now the Holy Father has agreed to visit Canada to continue the healing and reconciliation process by apologizing to Indigenous people on Canadian soil. Morover, the Canadian Bishops Conference has made a commitment to raise \$30 million for various ongoing reconciliation projects, in addition to the \$57 million already given by Catholic entities through the Indian Residential Schools Settlement Agreement.
