#### THE PASTOR'S CHRISTMAS MESSAGE

Christmas was the holy day closest to the heart of Saint Francis of Assisi, who, although he lived more than a thousand years after the birth of Christ, will forever be associated with Christmas. In 1223, in the little Italian town



of Greccio, Francis caused a representation of the Nativity event to be assembled to remind the faithful in a visible and tangible way of the poverty and simplicity of this Birth. Following Francis' example, the Christmas Crib has become a popular tradition throughout Christendom. That Christmas Eve in Greccio, after Mass was celebrated over the manger, a certain man "saw a little child lying in the manger lifeless" and he saw Francis lift up the Child who became alive in his arms. Saint Francis' first biographer, Thomas of Celano comments, "This vision was not unfitting, for the Child Jesus had been forgotten in the hearts of many, but, by the working of His grace, He was brought to life again through His servant Saint Francis" (1 Celano 86).

My hope and prayer for all parishioners and friends of St. Dunstan's, is that we welcome our Saviour this Christmas and allow Him to be born in our hearts, that with Jesus alive in us, we may be instruments of God's peace, to bring Him to life in the hearts of those around us. #### **FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY**

This Friday, December 30, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Jospeh, and we pray that that God will bless all families with His peace and love. Our faith urges us to defend the stability of the family, the true meaning of marriage and the sanctity of human life at every stage which the family must nourish. A special blessing will be given to families at the 9:00 a.m. Mass on Friday.

#### **CHRISTMAS SEASON**

Christmas which is the shortest of the Church's seasons, is liturgically rich and especially meaningful and beloved to the Christian people. It celebrates the birth of the Lord Jesus our Saviour and the ways He manifested the presence of God among us. For the Church, only the Easter celebration of the Lord's death and rising is more important.

Christmas and its Octave centre on the great truth and mystery of the Incarnation ~ that God loves us and sent His only begotten Son in the flesh to redeem us that we might believe in Him and have eternal life. Epiphany celebrates Christ's manifestation to the world, represented by the wise men from afar. Jesus is announced as the Saviour of all people.

The Christmas season and cycle ends with the Feast of the Lord's Baptism which continues the theme of Christ's manifestation as John the Baptist points Him out as the Lamb of God and the Father's voice is heard and the Spirit is seen as a dove, attesting to the Son's mission and identity.

#### **OUR CENTENNIAL YEAR BEGINS**

St. Dunstan's Parish was canonically erected in 1923 by Archbishop Neil McNeil. The first Mass was celebrated on October 17, 1923 in the original church (the present church is the third on this site) and on October 28, 1923 the church was solemnly blessed by His Grace the Archbishop. The New Year 2023 marks the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of our parish and we invite all our parishioners and friends to the opening celebration to inaugurate our Centennial next Saturday, December 31 at the 5:00 p.m. Mass, Most Reverend Robert Kasun, CSB, Auxiliary Bishop of Toronto will be the principal ceebrant with a guest choir and musicians. The Mass will be followed by a festive reception. A number of Centennial events will be held throughout 2023.
