Baptism:

Second and Fourth Sunday of the Month by appointment only, after completion of a Baptismal Preparation Class. Please pick-up a Baptismal Package from the parish office, read, complete and return same before registering to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. Upon class completion a date will be set for the Baptism.

Marriage:

The Church asks all couples, whether they are to be married here or overseas, to contact the parish 1 year in advance of their planned date of marriage. Couples are also expected to attend and complete a Marriage Preparation Course. If either party has previously gone through any form of marriage, civil or religious, the priest is not to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted.

MARRIAGE SUNDAY

The Archdiocese of Toronto will celebrate its annual Marriage Sunday next Sunday, February 12 as an opportunity to acknowledge the importance of marriage to the Church and civil society, and to celebrate the fidelity of Catholic couples united in the Sacrament of Marriage. Prayers and a blessing will be offered for married couples at all Sunday Masses on the weekend of February 12-13. As part of the Marriage Sunday celebration, Bishop Vincent Nguyen, Auxiliary Bishop of Toronto, will preside at a special Mass on February 12 at 2:30 p.m. at St. Michael's Cathedral Basilica. Obviously, this celebration is for Catholics in valid marriages recognized by the Church. WORLD DAY OF THE SICK

The Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, February 11 is also observed as the World Day of the Sick, an opportunity to pray for our sick relatives, friends and members of our parish community. In these days especially, we pray for all those who have contracted the coronavirus and for an end to the pandemic which has taken so many lives and impacted the whole world. Our parish will celebrate this occasion at the 10:00 a.m. Mass on Saturday, February 11 with special prayers for the sick and healthcare workers. After the homily, parishioners with a serious illness or disability, and those whose health has been weakened due to advanced age are invited to receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick.

SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

As we celebrate the World Day of the Sick, it is appropriate to restate the Church's understanding of the Sacrament of Anointing. Since the Second Vatican Council, the Church has encouraged a wider reception of this sacrament. Anointing should not, therefore, be considered as only for those at the point of death. Rather, all those who are even in a remote danger of death due to serious illness, disability or advanced age may receive this sacrament of God's mercy and consolation.

Please note that hospitals usually have designated priest chaplains on call for spiritual care and sacraments. Those needing a priest for themselves or their loved ones should contact the nursing station.

CENTENNIAL TRIP TO ENGLAND

One of our projects to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of our parish is a trip to England, the birthplace of our parish titular and patron, Saint Dunstan of Canterbury (910 - 988). Saint Dunstan was successively the Abbot of Glastonbury Abbey, Bishop of Worcester, London and finally of the primatial see of Canterbury. Our trip is booked July 12-20. We will be staying at one hotel in London for the duration of the trip. Lots of free time for shopping and exploring on your own. Besides seeing the sights of London including Buckingham Palace, Big Ben and the Parliament Buildings, and Westminster Abbey, we will visit the Tower of London to view the Crown Jewels, and where Saint Thomas More was imprisoned and beheaded. One day we will visit Windsor Castle and Stonehenge, and another day we will travel to Canterbury to see the resting place of Saint Dunstan in Canterbury Cathedral where Saint Thomas Becket was martyred in 1170. Cost per person, double occupancy is \$4,580 which includes 7 nights' accommodation, english breakfast daily and 5 three-course dinners, and coach transportation to Windsor, Stonehenge and Canterbury.

CATECHUMENATE

Last weekend at the Saturday, 5:00 p.m. Mass we welcomed two catechumens, Madushika Ekanayake and Dhruba Ray in the brief *Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens*. These adults have been following our course of instruction in the Catholic faith and are preparing for Baptism at Easter. At the Rite last Saturday they publicly declared to the Church their intention to follow the Christian way of life. We should all rejoice in their decision and support them with our prayers for perseverance in their spiritual journey.
