

Baptism:

Second and Fourth Sunday of the Month by appointment only, after completion of a Baptismal Preparation Class. Please pick-up a Baptismal Package from the parish office, read, complete and return same before registering to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. Upon class completion a date will be set for the Baptism.

Marriage:

The Church asks all couples, whether they are to be married here or overseas, to contact the parish 1 year in advance of their planned date of marriage. Couples are also expected to attend and complete a Marriage Preparation Course. If either party has previously gone through any form of marriage, civil or religious, the priest is not to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted.

CORONATION OF KING CHARLES

This weekend the United Kingdom, Canada and various other realms and the nations of the Commonwealth celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III who acceded to the throne on the death of the beloved Queen Elizabeth II last September 8. As he is confirmed in his role as Sovereign and Head of the Commonwealth we pray that he will



follow his mother's example of duty and selfless service and receive God's gifts of wisdom and right judgment in the exercise of his high office.

The Processional Cross used in the Coronation contains a relic of the Cross of Christ, a gift from Pope Francis.

PRAYER FOR THE KING

Almighty God, we pray that your servant Charles, our King who, by your providence, has received the governance of this realm, may continue to grow in every virtue, that imbued with your heavenly grace, he may be preserved from all that is harmful and evil and, being blessed with your favour, may with the royal family, come at last into your presence, through Christ who is the way, truth and the life and who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

EASTER DUTY

The Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church lists five precepts "which are meant to guarantee to the faithful the indispensable minimum in the spirit of prayer, the sacramental life, moral commitment and growth in love of God and neighbour" (#431). All Catholics are bound in conscience to observe these precepts which are considered "necessary for salvation" (#430) Among these precepts are the following two which constitute our "Easter Duty": "to confess one's sins, receiving the sacrament of Reconciliation at least once a year" and "receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season". (#432) To obey these precepts is a serious obligation for all Catholics. The time for fulfilling our Easter duty annually is from Ash Wednesday to Pentecost Sunday.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

Today we rejoice in celebrating the First Holy Communion of nine children of our parish. We pray that they, their families and all of us grow in our love and gratitude for the wonderful Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, God's gift for the life of the world. May we always long for the Bread of Life, Jesus Himself in the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar.

FEAST OF SAINT DUNSTAN

On Friday, May 19, our parish will celebrate our patron saint and titular of our church, Saint Dunstan (910-988). This Solemnity takes on special meaning this year as our parish celebrates its 100th Anniversary. Everyone is invited to celebrate our Patron at the Solemn Mass on May 19, at 7:00 p.m. which will be celebrated by the Most Reverend Robert Kasun CSB, Auxiliary Bishop of Toronto. A reception in the Parish Lounge will follow the Mass.

Saint Dunstan is considered the most famous of all the Anglo-Saxon saints. Born in Glastonbury, England, he became a Benedictine monk and did much to promote monastic life in England. Appointed Abbot of Glastonbury, he made the Abbey an important centre of culture and learning. Later he was successively Bishop of Worcester, then London and finally Archbishop of the primatial See of Canterbury. He was counsellor to several Kings of England. He was a teacher, an artisan and musician. He is buried beneath the pavement of the sanctuary of Canterbury Cathedral in England.
