

Baptism:

Second and Fourth Sunday of the Month by appointment only, after completion of a Baptismal Preparation Class. Please pick-up a Baptismal Package from the parish office, read, complete and return same before registering to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. Upon class completion a date will be set for the Baptism.

Marriage:

The Church asks all couples, whether they are to be married here or overseas, to contact the parish 1 year in advance of their planned date of marriage. Couples are also expected to attend and complete a Marriage Preparation Course. If either party has previously gone through any form of marriage, civil or religious, the priest is not to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted.

CORPUS CHRISTI

This important feast commemorates the central role of the Holy Eucharist in the Church's life and worship. The celebration of the Eucharist, most often called the Holy Mass, is the distinctive act of worship for Christians. For almost two thousand years, Christians have been gathering especially on Sunday, the Lord's Day to celebrate the



Eucharist in memory of Jesus as He commanded at the Last Supper. We believe that by the words of consecration spoken by the priest at Mass, the elements of bread and wine become the Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus, a change which the Church calls "transubstantiation". The Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament: "My flesh is real food, My blood is real drink" (John 6:55) means that in Holy Communion, we are receiving Christ Himself. The Church encourages Catholics to receive the Eucharist frequently if they are free from mortal sin, have the proper dispositions of faith, love and reverence, and have fasted from ordinary food and drink for one hour. Adoration of Christ truly present in the Holy Eucharist whether reserved in the tabernacle or exposed in the monstrance on the altar has been encouraged by numerous popes and saints.

Due to the pandemic, it has been four years since we have had an outdoor procession with the Blessed Sacrament or special eucharistic devotions to mark this Solemnity. As we transition back to a more regular parish schedule

and there is some question about the necessity of permits for an outdoor procession, this year we will observe Corpus Christi with a procession <u>inside</u> the church following *the 12:00 noon Mass this Sunday, June 11*, followed by devotions and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Everyone is invited to stay after Mass as we pay homage to our eucharistic Lord and King.

MONTH OF THE SACRED HEART

Traditionally, Catholics have observed the month of Jesus as the month of the Sacred Heart, a time of special devotion celebrating the love and mercy of God symbolized by the Heart of Jesus. This coming Friday, June 16 is the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart and the World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests. This later designation

was introduced by Saint John Paul II to give the faithful an opportunity to pray for their shepherds and for their perseverance in the grace of their ordination. This association of priests with the Sacred Heart is very appropriate since the priesthood established by Christ is a sign of His love and presence. Saint John Vianney, patron saint of parish priests, famously said that "the priesthood is the love of the Heart of Jesus" since the priesthood exists for the service and sanctification of the faithful. The priest acts in persona Christi as an instrument to bring God's grace to people, especially when he celebrates the sacraments and in particular the Holy Eucharist.

Our new Archbishop Francis Leo has written a Pastoral Letter to the faithful of the Archdiocese on the subject of this month dedicated to the Sacred Heart. Copies are available in the vestibule. Our former Archbishop, Cardinal Collins wrote a similar Pastoral Letter some years ago entitled



"Heart Speaks to Heart". Regarding the image of the Sacred Heart, he wrote: "The Sacred Heart is surrounded by flames. These are flames of glory, for love of the quality represented by the love of Jesus is truly glorious. They are flames that provide light in a world darkened by sin, and warmth in a world that too often is cold, that treats people as things to be used, not as persons to be loved. They are flames of zeal, sign of fire that came down upon the disciples at Pentecost, as they were sent out to set the world on fire for Christ, as are we all".
