Please pick-up a Baptismal Package from the parish office, read, complete and return same before registering to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. Upon class completion a date will be set for the Baptism.

Marriage:

The Church asks all couples, whether they are to be married here or overseas, to contact the parish 1 year in advance of their planned date of marriage. Couples are also expected to attend and complete a Marriage Preparation Course. If either party has previously gone through any form of marriage, civil or religious, the priest is not to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted.

MONTH OF THE SACRED HEART

During this month of the Sacred heart, we remember and celebrate in a special way the tender love and mercy of God symbolized by the Heart of Jesus. This past Friday, the Church observed the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and the World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests.



In honour of this month our new Archbishop Francis Leo has written a Pastoral Letter to the faithful on this precious object of devotion which is the Heart of Jesus. He links this symbol with the crucifix when the Heart of Jesus stopped beating as He gave His life for our salvation out of love. Archbishop Leo writes:

“Symbols carry meaning and are powerful in conveying truths and inspiring to action. For Catholic Christians the Crucifix and the Sacred Heart of Jesus are the authentic and unsurpassed symbols of love, welcoming and compassion.”
