



Baptism:

Second and Fourth Sunday of the Month by appointment only, after completion of a Baptismal Preparation Class. Please pick-up a Baptismal Package from the parish office, read, complete and return same before registering to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. Upon class completion a date will be set for the Baptism.

Marriage:

The Church asks all couples, whether they are to be married here or overseas, to contact the parish 1 year in advance of their planned date of marriage. Couples are also expected to attend and complete a Marriage Preparation Course. If either party has previously gone through any form of marriage, civil or religious, the priest is not to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted.



SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD

Pope Francis has decreed that henceforth, the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be observed as the Sunday of the Word of God, a special day devoted to "the celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God" (Aperuit illis). This observance will help the Church "experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of His word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world". The Second Vatican Council and recent popes have encouraged Catholics to love and proclaim the Scriptures as the inerrant and inspired Word of God. Following the Council, the Church added a third reading to the Sunday Liturgy and introduced a three-year cycle of readings, thus opening up a wider selection of the Sacred Scripture to be proclaimed at Mass. This new observance adds emphasis to the importance of the Bible, which, although the most widely published and distributed book, often ends up unread and unused, gathering dust on a shelf. Reading the Scriptures is not just for scholars but for all the faithful. As Saint Jerome famously said "Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ."

THE WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

The annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity begins Thursday, January 18 and continues until the following Thursday, January 25, the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul. It is an opportunity for all Christians to pray for the restoration of unity among all Christ's followers according to His desire expressed at the Last Supper, "that they may all be one" (John 20:21). The Catholic Church is committed to ecumenical dialogue and this observance reminds Catholics of their responsibility to pray and work for Christian unity.

The theme for this years' observance is "You shall love the Lord your God...and your neighbour as yourself" (Lk 10:27), inspiring us to pray and work together for the unity willed by God for the Church. As the Second Vatican Council taught: "change of heart and holiness of life, along with public and private prayer for the unity of Christians, should be regarded as the soul of the whole ecumenical movement, and merits the name, 'spiritual ecumenism'", (*Unitatis redintegratio*, 8).

Everyone is invited to join Archbishop Leo and a wide representation of Christian leaders to pray for the restoration of full visible unity today, Sunday, January 21 at 4:00 p.m. at St. Mark Coptic Orthodox Cathedral, 455 Ferrier Street, Markham.
