

Baptism:

Second and Fourth Sunday of the Month by appointment only, after completion of a Baptismal Preparation Class. Please pick-up a Baptismal Package from the parish office, read, complete and return same before registering to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. Upon class completion a date will be set for the Baptism.

Marriage:

The Church asks all couples, whether they are to be married here or overseas, to contact the parish 1 year in advance of their planned date of marriage. Couples are also expected to attend and complete a Marriage Preparation Course. If either party has previously gone through any form of marriage, civil or religious, the priest is not to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted.



DIVINE MERCY

"Throughout the world the Second Sunday of Easter will receive the name Divine Mercy Sunday, a perennial invitation...to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that humanity will experience in the years to come". In the Year of the Great Jubilee 2000, Pope John Paul II used these words to inaugurate Divine Mercy Sunday, a feast to be celebrated every year on the Second Sunday of Easter.

The feast came at the urging of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska (1903-1938), a Polish religious sister and visionary. In her diary, she wrote how Jesus had told her: "I will pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of my mercy...Let no one fear to draw near to me, even though their sins be as scarlet" (Diary, 699).

The Divine Mercy Novena which began on Good Friday concluded on Easter Saturday. Mercy Sunday will be observed with special devotions at **3:00 p.m.** today including the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, adoration and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. *The message and devotion of Divine*

Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, who received revelations from Jesus about God's Mercy. The message of Mercy is that God loves us and that we can always call upon and trust in His mercy. We too can be instruments of His mercy to others. This devotion was especially dear to Saint John Paul II who established this feast for the Universal Church.

ANNUNCIATION AND CONSECRATION TO MARY

In a letter of 22 March 2024, Pope Francis invited Catholics to annually renew our Act of Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary on the Solemnity of the Annunciation (which is usually observed on 25 March, but which is transferred

this year to Monday 8 April, since March 25 fell during Holy Week this year). Accordingly, Archbishop Leo has asked all parishes to join him in an Archdiocesan Consecration to Our Lady on 8 April.



St. Dunstan's has already been making an Act of Consecration to

Mary for several years during the month of May, but we will gladly make this Act of Consecration as requested on **Monday 8 April at the 7:00 p.m.** Solemn Mass on the Solemnity of the Annunciation. As Archbishop Leo writes "Mary is the gift that the Crucified Christ entrusted to his family, the Church, indeed to every disciple down through the ages and with the consecration, we do what the Beloved Disciple did: we bring her home," and expresses the hope that through this Archdiocesan consecration "we shall enjoy abundant divine consolations" and "be empowered with gifts from on High" and thus "be pleasing to the Lord."

CHALICE CHILD SPONSORSHIP

Chalice is Canada's largest Catholic child sponsorship organization, founded in 1992 by Father Pat Cosgrove in Nova Scotia. It now supports 50,000 children in 13 developing countries. Chalice works with parents and guardians to help children with their individual needs whether it is food, medicine, clean water and especially education to the whole family.

Chalice has an A rating with Charity Intelligence and ranked in the top 100 charities with 90% of every dollar donated going to support sponsored children and their families.

Deacon Philip Allard who has been a Chalice speaker for many years will make an appeal for Chalice next weekend, April 13-14 at the Sunday Masses here in St. Dunstan's.
