

Baptism:

Second and Fourth Sunday of the Month by appointment only, after completion of a Baptismal Preparation Class. Please pick-up a Baptismal Package from the parish office, read, complete and return same before registering to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. Upon class completion a date will be set for the Baptism.

Marriage:

The Church asks all couples, whether they are to be married here or overseas, to contact the parish 1 year in advance of their planned date of marriage. Couples are also expected to attend and complete a Marriage Preparation Course. If either party has previously gone through any form of marriage, civil or religious, the priest is not to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted.

SOLEMNITY OF PENTECOST

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost, one of the Church's greatest feasts, marking the completion of



Christ's earthly mission and the beginning of the Spirit's mission in the Church. Today the Church implores anew the outpouring of the gifts of the Holy Spirit on all her children. This feast can be considered the birthday of the Church. On this day the catholicity of the Church was demonstrated as Peter's preaching was heard and understood in the various languages of the pilgrims in Jerusalem. From the Holy City, the Gospel was proclaimed to the ends of the earth. Today we celebrate the perennial youthfulness of the Church.

At St. Dunstan's we offer our prayers for our newly-confirmed young people, who received the Gift of the Holy Spirit this weekend.

CONGRATULATIONS to the young people of our parish who were confirmed yesterday, Saturday, 18 May at the 5:00 p.m. Mass. In these times, which are so challenging for Catholic youth to be faithful, let us pray that the newly-confirmed, strengthened by the Gift of the Holy Spirit, will remain committed to Christ and His Church and show the way to their peers.

SOLEMNITY OF SAINT DUNSTAN

This Wednesday, May 22, our parish will celebrate our patron saint and titular of our church, Saint Dunstan (910-988), transferred from May 19 which fell on Pentecost Sunday this year. *Everyone is invited to celebrate our Patron at the Solemn Mass on May 22, at 7:00 p.m.* Saint Dunstan is considered the most famous of all the Ango-Saxon saints. Born in Glastonbury, England, he became a Benedictine monk and did much to promote monastic life in England. Appointed Abbot of Glastonbury, he made the Abbey an important centre of culture and learning. Later he was successively Bishop of Worcester, then London and finally Archbishop of the primatial See of Canterbury. He was counsellor to several Kings of England. He was a teacher, an artisan and musician. He is buried beneath the pavement of the sanctuary of Canterbury Cathedral in England.

IMAGE OF SAINT DUNSTAN

On 2 May, the image of our patron, Saint Dunstan was installed in the church. This medieval-style painting with frame is the work of Luke Belanger, commissioned during our 100^{th} Anniversary Year. The image is a faithful copy of the frontispiece to a commentary on the Rule of Saint Benedict, transcribed about the year 1180 which is preserved in the British Library (Royal Manuscript 10.A.xiii). The painting portrays Saint Dunstan as a scribe, writing the opening words of the Benedictine Rule (Dunstan was a Benedictine monk and was for many years Abbot of the Glastonbury Abbey): "Obsculta, o fili, precepta magistri" Latin for "Hearken, O son, to the teaching of the Master." Saint Dunstan is dressed as a bishop with mitre and pallium (indicative of his office as Archbishop) with a blue chasable and red dalmatic.

Luke Belanger has done work for our parish previously. A decade ago, he built the altar of reservation to accommodate the new larger tabernacle. Last year, for our Centennial, he produced the new frontal for the main altar. On the same day he installed the painting of our Patron, he also delivered the pedestal he made for Our Lady's statue which is displayed for the month of May. The new image will be blessed at the Solemn Mass to celebrate Saint Dunstan's feast day on May 22.
