

## **Baptism**:

Second and Fourth Sunday of the Month by appointment only, after completion of a Baptismal Preparation Class. Please pick-up a Baptismal Package from the parish office, read, complete and return same before registering to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. Upon class completion a date will be set for the Baptism.

## Marriage:

The Church asks all couples, whether they are to be married here or overseas, to contact the parish 1 year in advance of their planned date of marriage. Couples are also expected to attend and complete a Marriage Preparation Course. If either party has previously gone through any form of marriage, civil or religious, the priest is not to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted.

#### THE TRADITION OF THE CHRISTMAS CRIB

"Following a beautiful and firmly-rooted tradition, many families set up their crib immediately after the feast of the Immaculate Conception, as if to relive with Mary those days full of trepidation that preceded the

birth of Jesus. Putting up the crib at home can be a simple but effective way of presenting faith, to pass it on to one's children. The crib helps us contemplate the mystery of



God's love that was revealed in the poverty and simplicity of the Bethlehem Grotto. Saint Francis of Assisi was so taken by the mystery of the Incarnation that he wanted to present it anew at Greccio in the living nativity scene, thus beginning an old, popular tradition that still retains its value for evangelization today. Indeed, the crib can help us understand the secret of the true Christmas because it speaks of the humility and merciful goodness of Christ, who "though he was rich he made himself poor" for us (2Cor 8:9). His poverty enriches those who embrace it and Christmas brings joy and peace to those who, like the shepherds in Bethlehem, accept the Angel's words: "Let this be a sign to you: in a manger you will find an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes" (Lk 2:12). This is still the sign for us too, men and women of the third millennium".

#### **ADVENT MOVIE SERIES**

Our Advent Movie Series got off to a good start with the beautifully-filmed and touching portrayal of "Mary of Nazareth" which moved everyone to tears. This week is "Maria Goretti", patroness of youth, who died defending her purity at the age of 12. The example of this model for Catholic youth is an inspiration for all ages. Before she died she forgave her assailant, although he remained unrepentant until Maria appeared to him in prison offering him roses for every wound he had inflicted. This vision brought about his conversion. Years later, when he was released, the first thing he did was to go to Maria's mother and beg forgiveness. He spent the rest of his life in prayer and penance working as a humble gardener at a Capuchin friary. He sat next to Maria's mother at the canonization ceremony when Maria was proclaimed a saint in 1950. The film has a running time of 1 1/2 hours. Because of the intensity of the subject matter this film is not suitable for young children, but is certainly recommended for teenagers and young adults.
