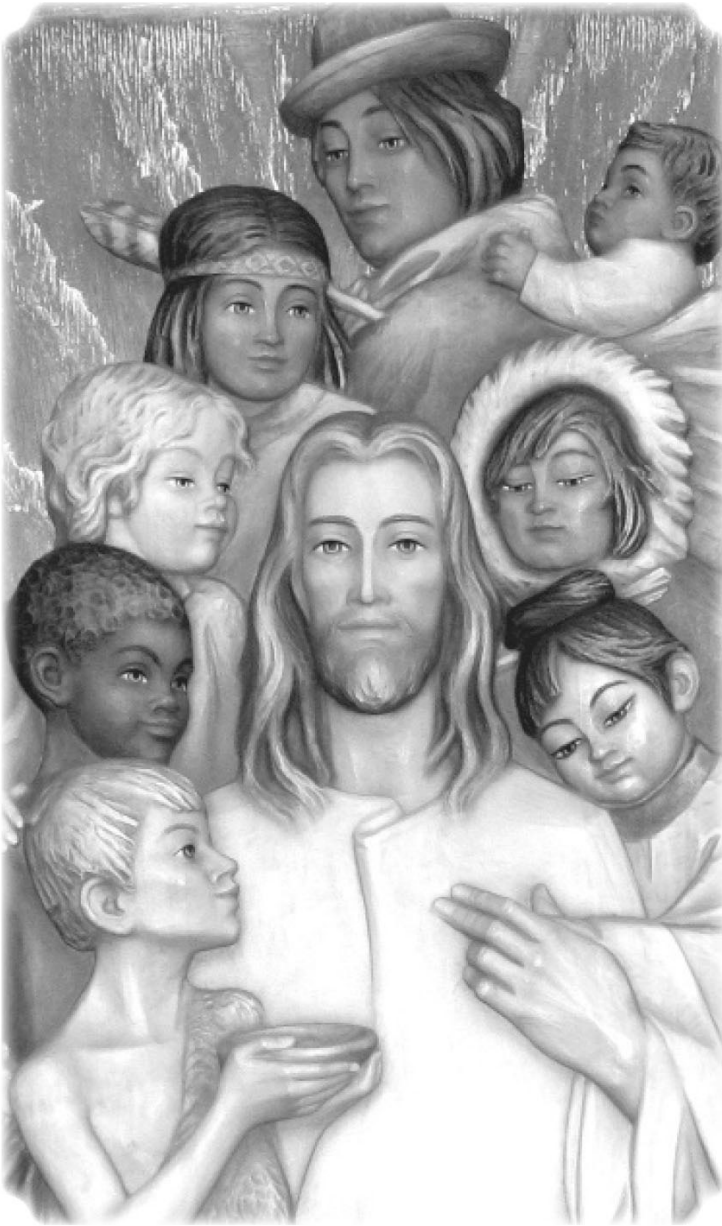

Baptism:

Second and Fourth Sunday of the Month by appointment only, after completion of a Baptismal Preparation Class. Please pick-up a Baptismal Package from the parish office, read, complete and return same before registering to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. Upon class completion a date will be set for the Baptism.

Marriage:

The Church asks all couples, whether they are to be married here or overseas, to contact the parish 1 year in advance of their planned date of marriage. Couples are also expected to attend and complete a Marriage Preparation Course. If either party has previously gone through any form of marriage, civil or religious, the priest is not to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted.

WORLD DAY OF THE SICK

The Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, February 11 is also observed as the World Day of the Sick. Our parish will celebrate this occasion with a special Mass **Tuesday, February 11 at 12:10 noon**. This Mass will include special prayers for the sick and administration of the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Since the Second Vatican Council, the Church has encouraged a wider reception of this sacrament. Accordingly, parishioners who are in even a remote danger of death due to sickness, disability or advanced age are invited to receive this sacrament of God's mercy and consolation.

Please note that hospitals usually have designated priest chaplains on call for spiritual care and sacraments. Those needing a priest for themselves or their loved ones should contact the nursing station.

SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing is not only for those who are at the point of death. It is intended for all who are seriously ill, including children who have reached the age of reason around the age of 7, and for those facing major surgery or treatment, or whose health is compromised by advanced age. Like all sacraments, Anointing of the Sick is a communal celebration and the Church recommends that it be celebrated in church with family and other members of the believing community. During the liturgy on Tuesday, 11 February at 12:10 noon to observe the World Day of the Sick, we will celebrate this sacrament of healing with the elderly and ill members of our parish. Everyone is invited to come and pray for their fellow parishioners who are ill.

JUBILEE PILGRIMAGE CHURCHES

As in the past, the Archdiocese has identified various churches to serve as special pilgrimage destinations during the Holy Year. These are St. Michael's Cathedral Basilica, the Martyrs Shrine in Midland; for the Central Region: St. Paul's Basilica, Toronto, St. Mary's, Toronto and St. Edward the Confessor, in North York; for the Western Region: Our Lady of Sorrows, Etobicoke and St. Mary's, Brampton; for the Eastern Region: St. Barnabas, Scarborough and St. Gregory the Great, Oshawa, for the Northern Region: St. Padre Pio, Kleinburg and St. Mary's, Barrie.

REGIONAL MASSES

The Archdiocese has announced Regional Masses to celebrate the elevation of our Archbishop, Francis Leo to the College of Cardinals and the beginning of the Holy Year of Jubilee. The Regional Masses for the Central Region which includes St. Dunstan's, are as follows: Wednesday, February 12 at St. Paul's Basilica, 83 Power Street at Queen with Bishop Kasun presiding; Thursday, February 20 at St. Mary's, 130 Bathurst, also with Bishop Kasun presiding; and Tuesday, February 25 at St. Edward the Confessor, North York with Cardinal Leo presiding. All Masses begin at 7:00 p.m. with the opportunity for confession for at least one hour prior to Mass. Please note that to gain the Jubilee indulgence for visiting these pilgrimage churches, one must go to confession, receive Holy Communion and pray for the intentions of the Holy Father.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

Children preparing for First Communion and candidates for Confirmation are reminded to see Father Jeff after Sunday Mass every week, to assure him of their presence.

JUBILEE MASS

Parishioners are encouraged to attend the Jubilee Mass for the Central Region of the Archdiocese at St. Paul's Basilica, 83 Power Street at Queen Street East, this coming Wednesday, February 12 at 7:00 p.m. to be celebrated by Auxiliary Bishop Robert Kasun. Confessions will be heard before the Mass from 5:30~6:45 p.m. (confession is necessary to obtain the Jubilee plenary indulgence). N.B. Please note that due to the Jubilee Mass at St. Paul's, the usual 7:00 p.m. Mass at St. Dunstan's is cancelled this Wednesday. For those who cannot attend the celebration at St. Paul's, Mass will be celebrated at 9:00 a.m. at St. Dunstan's.

THE JUBILEE INDULGENCE

The Gift of the Indulgence is an important feature of the Jubilee Year. Pilgrims to Rome will be visiting the four major Basilicas, entering through the Holy Doors, and making a devout visit by attending Mass or spending time in prayer or eucharistic adoration and reciting the Lord's Prayer and the Creed, under the usual conditions of confession, Holy Communion and prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father (at least one Our Father and Hail Mary). The same conditions apply for visiting any of the Jubilee Churches designated by the Archdiocese. An indulgence is the remission of the temporal punishment due to sins already forgiven in the Sacrament of Penance. In addition to the prescribed act (such as making a devout visit to Jubilee churches and reciting the Lord's Prayer and the Creed) one must go to confession within several days before or after the prescribed act, receive Holy Communion and pray at least one Our Father and Hail Mary for the Pope. For a plenary indulgence, one must be free from all attachment to sin, even venial sin. The Jubilee Indulgence may be applied in suffrage to the souls in purgatory which is a most commendable act of mercy. If the conditions are not fully met, the indulgence would be partial.
