

Baptism:

Second and Fourth Sunday of the Month by appointment only, after completion of a Baptismal Preparation Class. Please pick-up a Baptismal Package from the parish office, read, complete and return same before registering to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. Upon class completion a date will be set for the Baptism.

Marriage:

The Church asks all couples, whether they are to be married here or overseas, to contact the parish 1 year in advance of their planned date of marriage. Couples are also expected to attend and complete a Marriage Preparation Course. If either party has previously gone through any form of marriage, civil or religious, the priest is not to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted.

PORTIUNCULA

The plenary indulgence originally granted to Saint Francis by Pope Honorius III in 1216 for visiting the church of Our Lady of the Angels in Assisi, also called the Portiuncula or "Little Portion", on the feast of its dedication, August 2, has been extended to every parish church in the world.

Accordingly, parishioners who make a devout visit to Saint Dunstan's Church from midday on August 1st through August 2nd and there recite the Lord's Prayer and the Creed, may gain a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the Sovereign Pontiff (at least one Our Father and one Hail Mary).

To gain the indulgence, all attachment to sin, even venial sin, must be absent. It is fitting that Holy Communion be received and the prayer for the Holy Father be said on the same day as the visit to the parish church.

A plenary indulgence remits all temporal punishment due to sin, the guilt of which has already been forgiven in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. If the conditions for gaining the plenary indulgence are not fully met, the remission of temporal punishment would be partial.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints" (1471).

FIRST FRIDAY

Please note that for the next two First Fridays, that is August 1 and September 5, there will be only one Mass at 9:00 a.m. (like other Fridays) and no eucharistic adoration.

ATTIRE IN CHURCH

Worshipping God at Sunday Mass is a privilege as well as an obligation. Summer activities and vacations can sometimes make getting to Mass each Sunday a challenge, and the warm weather may cause us to dress less modestly. The way we dress when we come to church, however, may reflect our attitude towards this sacred duty. In fact, the Mass is such a treasure we should approach all aspects of the Eucharistic celebration with care and reverence. Just as we should make an effort to arrive at church on time, and to participate fully by praying, listening and singing, we should also take care to dress appropriately. In this regard, parishioners should take care that their clothing (T-shirts, for example) does not carry any improper or offensive images or slogans.

Wearing our "Sunday Best" as the saying goes, indicates that we understand that assisting at Mass is something special and important. Think about how you would dress if you were meeting a distinguished person like the King or the Pope, or how we dress for significant occasions like a wedding or First Communion.

It is not that we are trying to impress God or others with our attire. It is just that what we wear when we come to church is another way of honouring God, and since Mass is a communal celebration, wearing good clothes also sends a message to our Catholic brothers and sisters that we value our time together in God's House. It is a sign of respect both for God and for His people assembled to worship Him.
