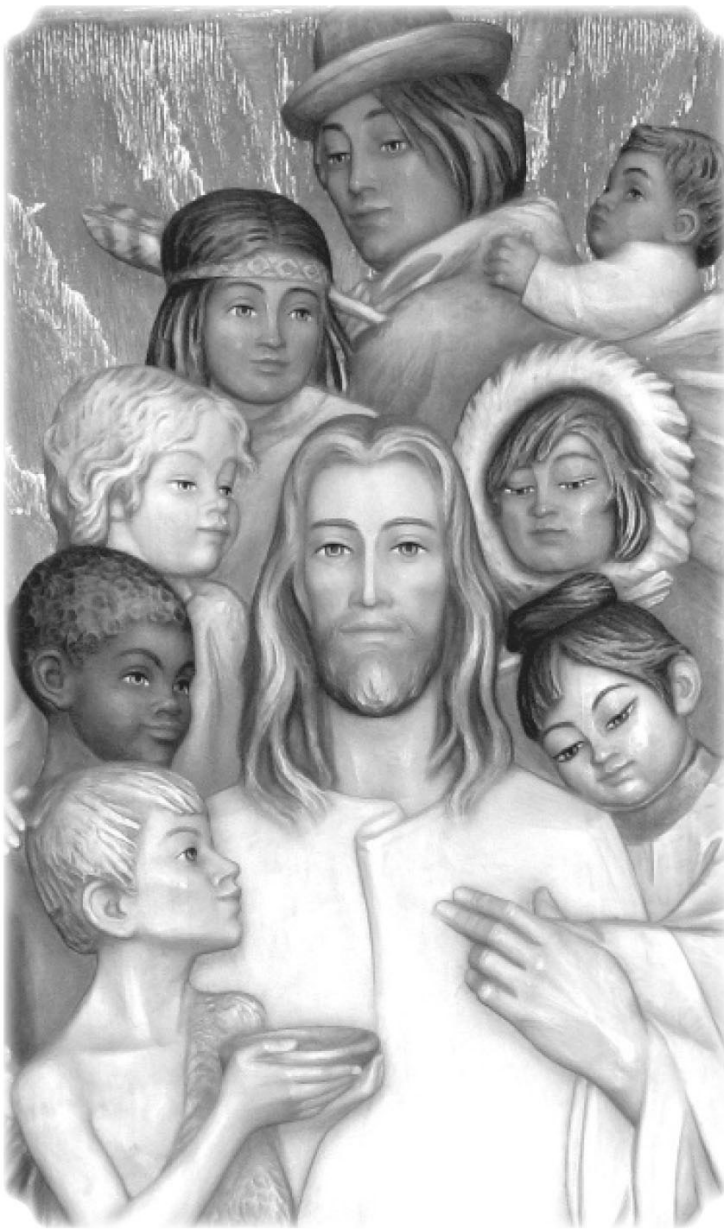

Upon class completion a date will be set for the Baptism.

## Marriage:

The Church asks all couples, whether they are to be married here or overseas, to contact the parish 1 year in advance of their planned date of marriage. Couples are also expected to attend and complete a Marriage Preparation Course. If either party has previously gone through any form of marriage, civil or religious, the priest is not to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted.

## PENTECOST SUNDAY

### SOLEMNITY OF PENTECOST

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost, one of the Church's greatest feasts, marking the completion of Christ's earthly mission and the beginning of the Spirit's mission in the Church. Today the Church implores anew the outpouring of the gifts of the Holy Spirit on all her children. This feast can be considered the birthday of the Church. On this day the catholicity of the Church was demonstrated as Peter's preaching was heard and understood in the various languages of the pilgrims in Jerusalem. From the Holy City, the Gospel was proclaimed to the ends of the earth. Today we celebrate the perennial youthfulness of the Church.

**CONGRATULATIONS** to the young people of our parish who were confirmed yesterday, Saturday, May 23 at the 5:00 p.m. Mass. In these times, which are so challenging for Catholic youth to be faithful, let us pray that the newly-confirmed, strengthened by the Gift of the Holy Spirit, will remain committed to Christ and His Church and show the way to their peers.

### CORPUS CHRISTI

This important feast commemorates the central role of the Holy Eucharist in the Church's life and worship. The celebration of the Eucharist, most often called the Holy Mass, is the distinctive act of worship for Christians. For almost two thousand years, Christians have been gathering especially on Sunday, the Lord's Day, to celebrate the Eucharist in memory of Jesus as He commanded at the Last Supper. Adoration of Christ truly present in the Holy Eucharist whether reserved in the tabernacle or exposed in the monstrance on the altar has been encouraged by numerous popes and saints. This year we will observe Corpus Christi with a procession inside the Church following the **12:00 noon Mass, June 7**, followed by devotions and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Everyone is invited to stay after Mass as we pay homage to our eucharistic Lord and King.



### MARIAN CELEBRATION

Catholics have traditionally observed the month of May as a time to honour Our Lady as Mother



and Queen with special devotions, recalling her irreplaceable role in God's plan for our salvation. Our Marian Celebration for the month of May will take place next **Saturday, May 30 at 10:00 a.m.**

The Rosary will be recited before Mass as usual. A votive Mass of Our Lady will be celebrated, followed by devotions, including a Prayer of Consecration. Everyone is invited to this special Marian Celebration for our parish.

**MARTYRS SHRINE**

The National Shrine to the Canadian Martyrs in Midland, Ontario (16163 Highway 12 West) is now open until Thanksgiving weekend in October. This major pilgrimage site, served by the Jesuits, is celebrating the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Shrine Church (1926) and a century of pilgrimage, encounter, and living faith. The Shrine Church was built following the beatification of the eight Canadian Martyrs in 1925. Saint John Paul II visited the Shrine in 1984 during his apostolic journey across Canada. The Martyrs Shrine and the reconstructed Ste-Marie Mission welcomes thousands of visitors each year. Everyone is invited to the Shrine to join in the celebration of its Centennial Year and to give thanks for the witness of the Martyrs and their Shrine. Two significant events to celebrate the Anniversary will be held next month: The Centennial Gala on Wednesday, June 3 from 5:30 – 10:00 p.m. at Bellevue Manor in Vaughan with special guest of honour, Archbishop Ivan Jurkovic, Apostolic Nuncio to Canada, representing the Holy Father; and a Solemn Mass of Thanksgiving on Saturday, June 27 at the Shrine, followed by a free concert with Juno Award-winning band Leahy.
