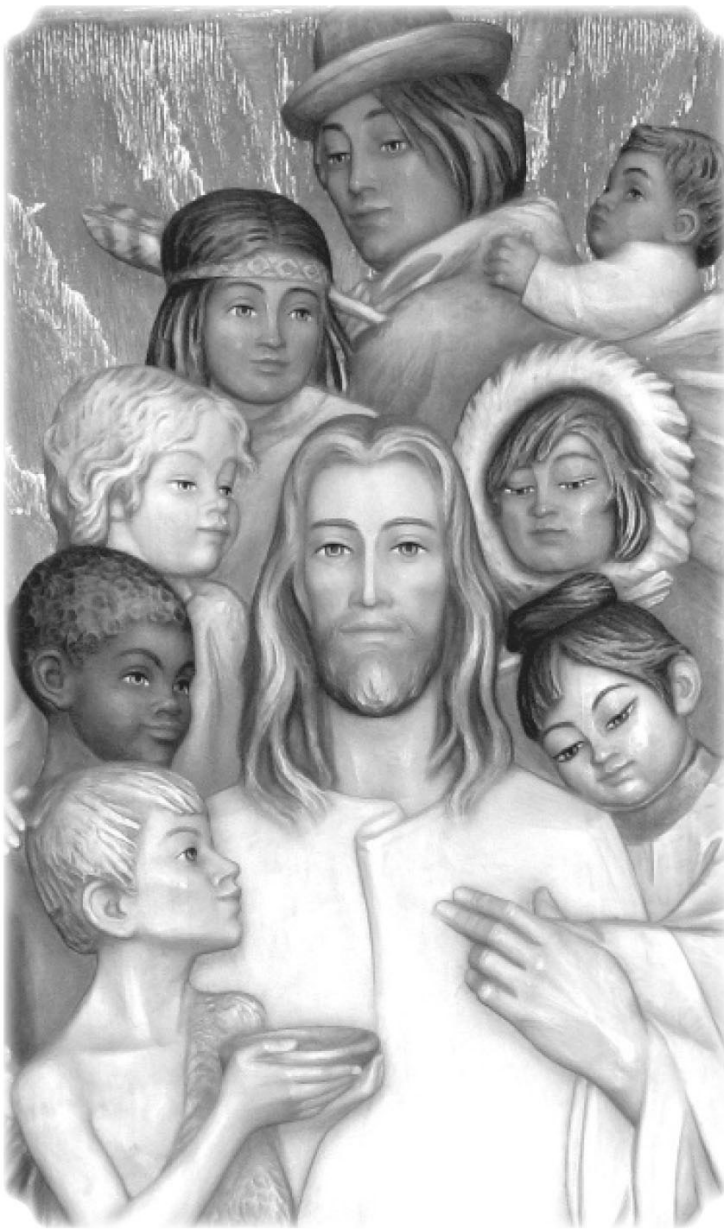

Baptism:

Second and Fourth Sunday of the Month by appointment only, after completion of a Baptismal Preparation Class. Please pick-up a Baptismal Package from the parish office, read, complete and return same before registering to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. Upon class completion a date will be set for the Baptism.

Marriage:

The Church asks all couples, whether they are to be married here or overseas, to contact the parish 1 year in advance of their planned date of marriage. Couples are also expected to attend and complete a Marriage Preparation Course. If either party has previously gone through any form of marriage, civil or religious, the priest is not to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted.

THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

CORPUS CHRISTI

Today's Solemnity commemorates the central role of the Holy Eucharist in the Church's life and worship. The celebration of the Eucharist, most often called the Holy Mass, is the distinctive act of worship for Christians. For almost two thousand years, Christians have been gathering especially on Sunday, the Lord's Day, to celebrate the Eucharist in memory of Jesus as He commanded at the Last Supper. We believe that by the words of consecration spoken by the priest at Mass, the elements of bread and wine become the Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus, a change which the Church calls "transubstantiation". The Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament: "My flesh is real food, My blood is real drink" (John 6:55) means that in Holy Communion, we are receiving Christ Himself. The Church encourages Catholics to receive the Eucharist frequently if they are free from mortal sin, have the proper dispositions of faith, love and reverence, and have fasted from ordinary food and drink for one hour. Adoration of Christ truly present in the Holy Eucharist whether reserved in the tabernacle or exposed in the monstrance on the altar has been encouraged by numerous popes and saints.



We will observe Corpus Christi with a procession inside the church following *the 12:00 noon Mass today*, followed by devotions and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Everyone is invited to stay after Mass as we pay homage to our eucharistic Lord and King.

PRECEPTS OF THE CHURCH

In the past few months, the Sunday bulletin has been reminding parishioners of their Easter duty to confess their sins at least once a year and receive Holy Communion during the Easter cycle of the liturgical year (between Ash Wednesday and Pentecost). The precepts of the Church are outlined in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (2041-46, 2048) and its Compendium (431-432). Because the precepts of the Church are considered normative and obligatory for all Catholics, it has been suggested that all five precepts should be printed for the convenience of our parishioners. They are:

1. You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labour.
2. You shall confess your sins at least once a year.
3. You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season.
4. You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.
5. You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church.

By means of these precepts, the Magisterium (Teaching Authority of the Church i.e. the Pope and bishops) guarantees "for the faithful the indispensable minimum in the spirit of prayer, the sacramental life, moral commitment and growth in love of God and neighbour" which is "necessary for salvation" (Compendium 431, 430). Though our weak and wounded human nature needs to know and follow these five precepts, it is to be hoped that generous souls who are sincerely striving for holiness, and with the prayers and example of the saints to inspire them, may, with God's help, go far beyond these "minimum" requirements.

MARIAN CELEBRATION

Many thanks to those who participated in our annual Marian Celebration on Saturday, May 30 in honour of Our Lady during her month of May. Several recent first communicants were involved in the May Crowning: Christopher Ceron who carried the crown, Simon Sunas who brought the floral offering, Chiziteve Onukaba who crowned the statue and Mashari Sagolili who helped serve the Mass. All present joined in making an Act of Consecration to the Blessed Virgin. On the same day, a number of the parishioners travelled to Villanova College in King City to join the second annual "Day with Mary" sponsored by the Archdiocese. Cardinal Leo was the principal celebrant of the Mass. By all accounts the day was successful, attended by a large number of the faithful from around the Archdiocese on a beautiful and warm spring day.
