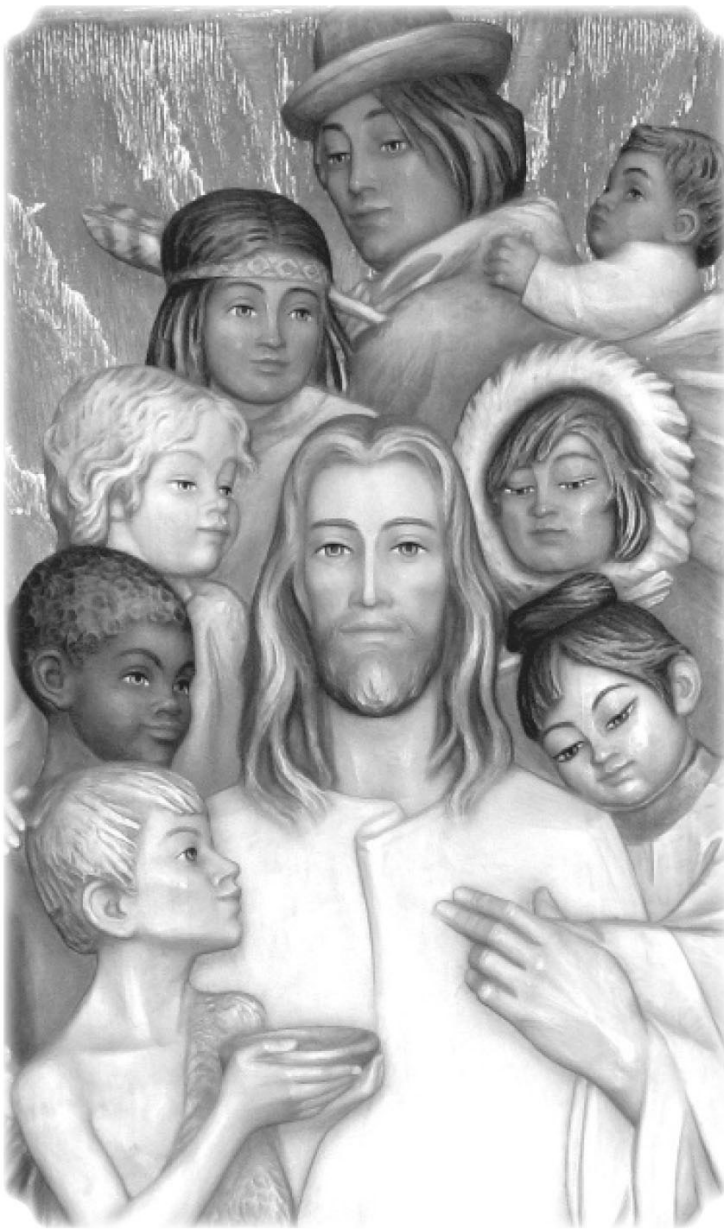

Upon class completion a date will be set for the Baptism.

Marriage:

The Church asks all couples, whether they are to be married here or overseas, to contact the parish 1 year in advance of their planned date of marriage. Couples are also expected to attend and complete a Marriage Preparation Course. If either party has previously gone through any form of marriage, civil or religious, the priest is not to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted.

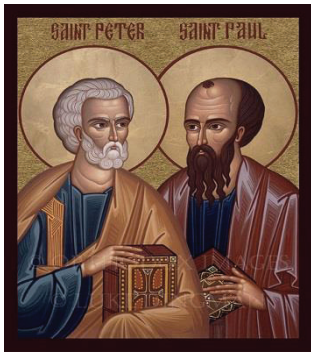
CANADA DAY

July 1 is celebrated as Canada's birthday, this year marking the 159th anniversary of Confederation. Canadian Catholics should seek to be witnesses to Christ in Canada and the world, and continue working to influence those in government to act from the Christian principles on which our modern country was founded. On this Canada Day, let us thank God for our beautiful country and pray for our Sovereign, our government, our armed forces and all our fellow citizens.

In addition to the Latin motto "A mari usque ad mare" ("From sea to sea", Psalm 72:8), the Royal Arms of Canada also includes this inscription "Desiderantes meliorem patriam" from the New Testament (Heb 11:16): "They desire a better country". This verse which is also the motto of the Order of Canada, our highest civilian honour, first of all refers to the longing to be with God in our heavenly homeland. As part of the Coat of Arms it refers to our desire to make our country better, a reminder for all Canadians. As Catholics we do this by praying and working to improve society and make it more just and human. Certainly, we ought to do this by letting our light shine through our good example of following Christ. The best thing we can do is proudly and publicly live our Catholic faith and shine the Gospel light on the important issues of our time. The preamble to the Charter of Rights and Freedoms which is part of the Constitution Act, states that Canada is founded on principles that recognize "the supremacy of God". If God is supreme, then people of faith must oppose man-made laws which contradict God's laws concerning the sanctity of human life, marriage and the family. This is our duty not only as Catholics, but as Canadians as well, as our foundational document makes clear. We are only insisting that the government, courts, and political parties obey the Constitution. Join us for Mass on Canada Day at 10:00 a.m. Wear something red and white.

SAINTS PETER AND PAUL

This Monday, 29 June, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, apostles. These two great witnesses, Peter, the Prince of the Apostles,



and Paul, the Teacher of the Gentiles, are honoured as the Founders of the Roman Church. Saint Peter is recognized as the first Pope, the "Rock" on which Christ built His Church and to whom He confided the keys of the kingdom of heaven (see Mt. 16:18). Saint Paul,

whose letters comprise a significant part of the New Testament, was also a great missionary and evangelizer. Both gave their lives for their Saviour, Peter by the cross and Paul by the sword, about 66 or 67 A.D. in Rome. Today, two great basilicas mark the places of their burials: St. Peter's in the Vatican, and St. Paul's outside the Walls.

Please note that during the summer months of July, August, and September, there will be only one Mass celebrated at 9:00 a.m. and no period of adoration.

MARTYRS SHRINE

The National Shrine to the Canadian Martyrs in Midland, Ontario (16163 Highway 12 West) is now open until Thanksgiving weekend in October. This major pilgrimage site, served by the Jesuits, is celebrating the 100th Anniversary of the Shrine Church (1926) and a century of pilgrimage, encounter, and living faith. The Shrine Church was built following the beatification of the eight Canadian Martyrs in 1925. Saint John Paul II visited the Shrine in 1984 during his apostolic journey across Canada. The Martyrs Shrine and the reconstructed Ste-Marie Mission welcomes thousands of visitors each year. Everyone is invited to the Shrine to join in the celebration of its Centennial Year and to give thanks for the witness of the Martyrs and their Shrine.
