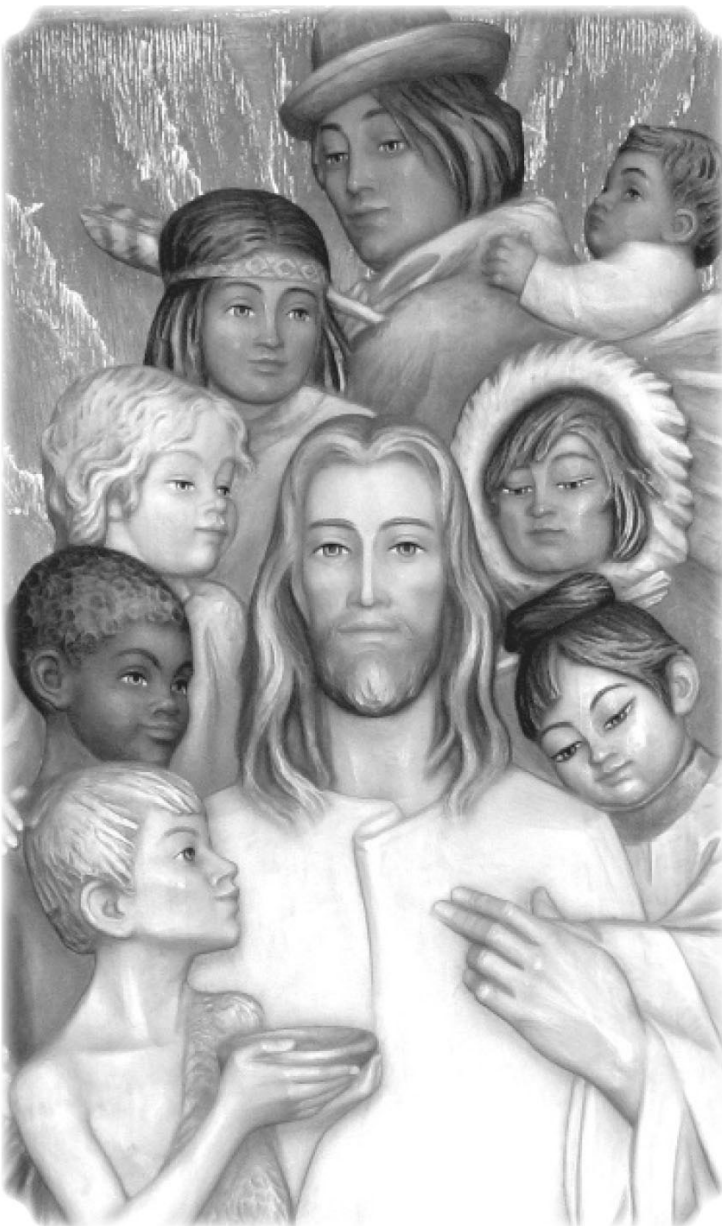

Baptism:

Second and Fourth Sunday of the Month by appointment only, after completion of a Baptismal Preparation Class. Please pick-up a Baptismal Package from the parish office, read, complete and return same before registering to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. Upon class completion a date will be set for the Baptism.

Marriage:

The Church asks all couples, whether they are to be married here or overseas, to contact the parish 1 year in advance of their planned date of marriage. Couples are also expected to attend and complete a Marriage Preparation Course. If either party has previously gone through any form of marriage, civil or religious, the priest is not to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted.



MARTYRS SHRINE

The National Shrine to the Canadian Martyrs in Midland, Ontario (16163 Highway 12 West) is now open until Thanksgiving weekend in October. This major pilgrimage site, served by the Jesuits, is celebrating the 100th Anniversary of the Shrine Church (1926) and a century of pilgrimage, encounter, and living faith. The Shrine Church was built following the beatification of the eight Canadian Martyrs in 1925. Saint John Paul II visited the Shrine in 1984 during his apostolic journey across Canada. The Martyrs Shrine and the reconstructed Ste-Marie Mission welcomes thousands of visitors each year. Everyone is invited to the Shrine to join in the celebration of its Centennial Year and to give thanks for the witness of the Martyrs and their Shrine. HUMANITARIAN RELIEF VENEZUELA EARTHQUAKE

A devastating series of earthquakes struck north-central Venezuela on June 24, making it the country's largest seismic disaster in more than a century. As of June 29, official reports indicate more than 1,400 people have died, 3,000 people have been injured, thousands are reported missing and tens of thousands of families have been left homeless.

ATTIRE IN CHURCH

Worshipping God at Sunday Mass is a privilege as well as an obligation. Summer activities and vacations can sometimes make getting to Mass each Sunday a challenge, and the warm weather may cause us to dress less modestly. The way we dress when we come to church, however, may reflect our attitude towards this sacred duty. In fact, the Mass is such a treasure we should approach all aspects of the Eucharistic celebration with care and reverence. Just as we should make an effort to arrive at church on time, and to participate fully by praying, listening and singing, we should also take care to dress appropriately. In this regard, parishioners should take care that their clothing (T-shirts, for example) does not carry any improper or offensive images or slogans.

Wearing our "Sunday Best" as the saying goes, indicates that we understand that assisting at Mass is something special and important. Think about how you would dress if you were meeting a distinguished person like the King or the Pope, or how we dress for significant occasions like a wedding or First Communion. It is not that we are trying to impress God or others with our attire. It is just that what we wear when we come to church is another way of honouring God, and since Mass is a communal celebration, wearing good clothes also sends a message to our Catholic brothers and sisters that we value our time together in God's House. It is a sign of respect both for God and for His people assembled to worship Him.
