GOSPEL INSPIRATION

A voice of one crying out in the desert: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths". It is the voice of John the Baptist.

This 2nd Sunday of Advent, as we begin to inch our way towards Christmas, the Liturgy calls us to repentance and to turn towards God. It exhorts us to fill the valleys of lethargy, of insufficient charity; and to level the mountain of sin, of spiritual dryness, of not being the best version of ourselves.

The 2nd Sunday of Advent launches us further into the heart of our preparation for the coming of Christ – getting ready for the Lord.

Fire-up preparation for Jesus at Christmas by repenting of our sins and making some resolve to re-order our steps, straightening thereby "the path of the Lord". At this time when nothing seems normal, it is good to come up with unique ideas to get ourselves started.

How about preparing a small altar in your house or lighting a candle each week of the season of advent? You could start today with the second candle. It's not too late. The candles could be lit particularly during family prayer times, times of online Masses etc. It is a means to ginger us into prayer and to prepare ourselves to receive the awesome baby Jesus at Christmas.
