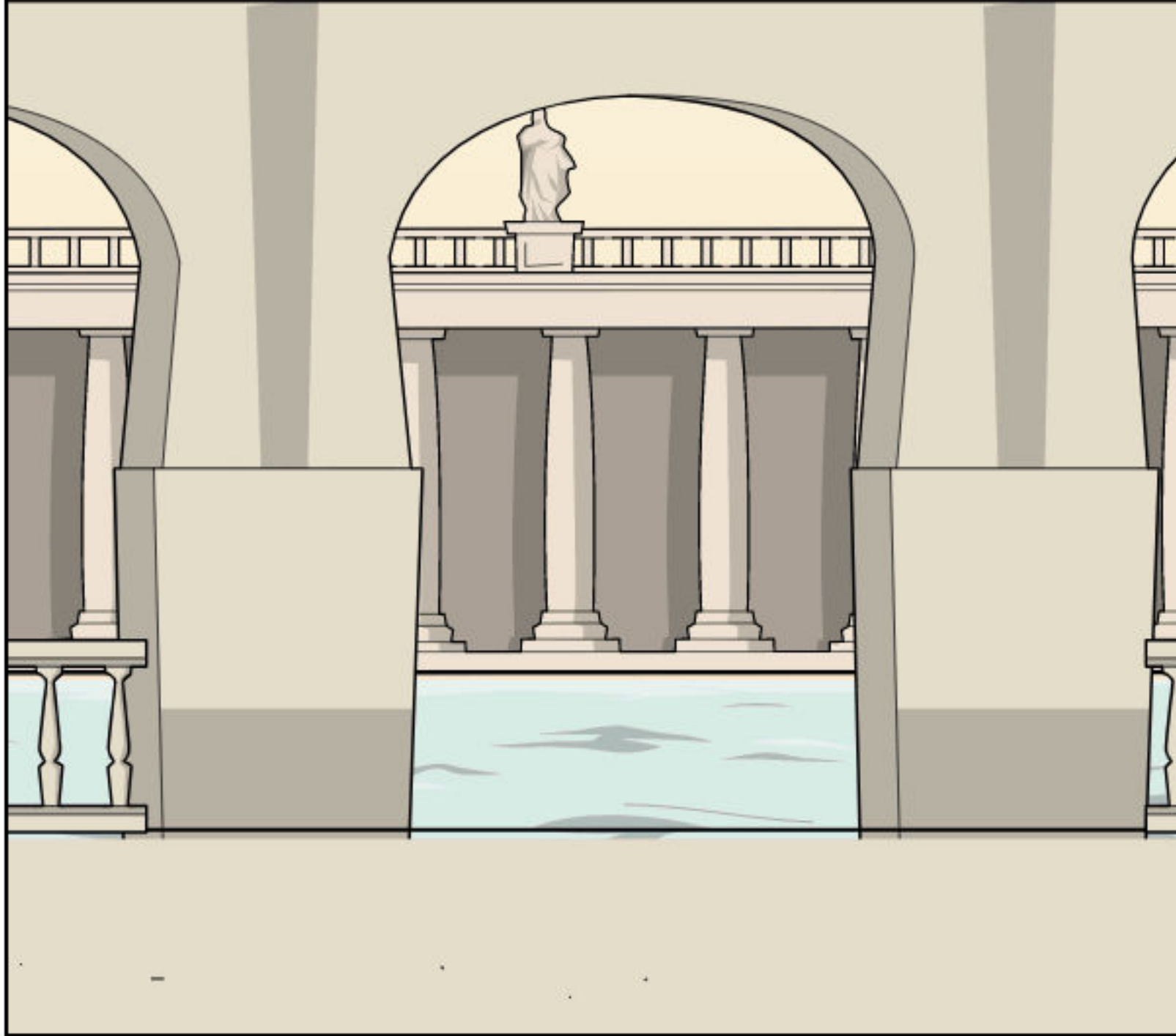


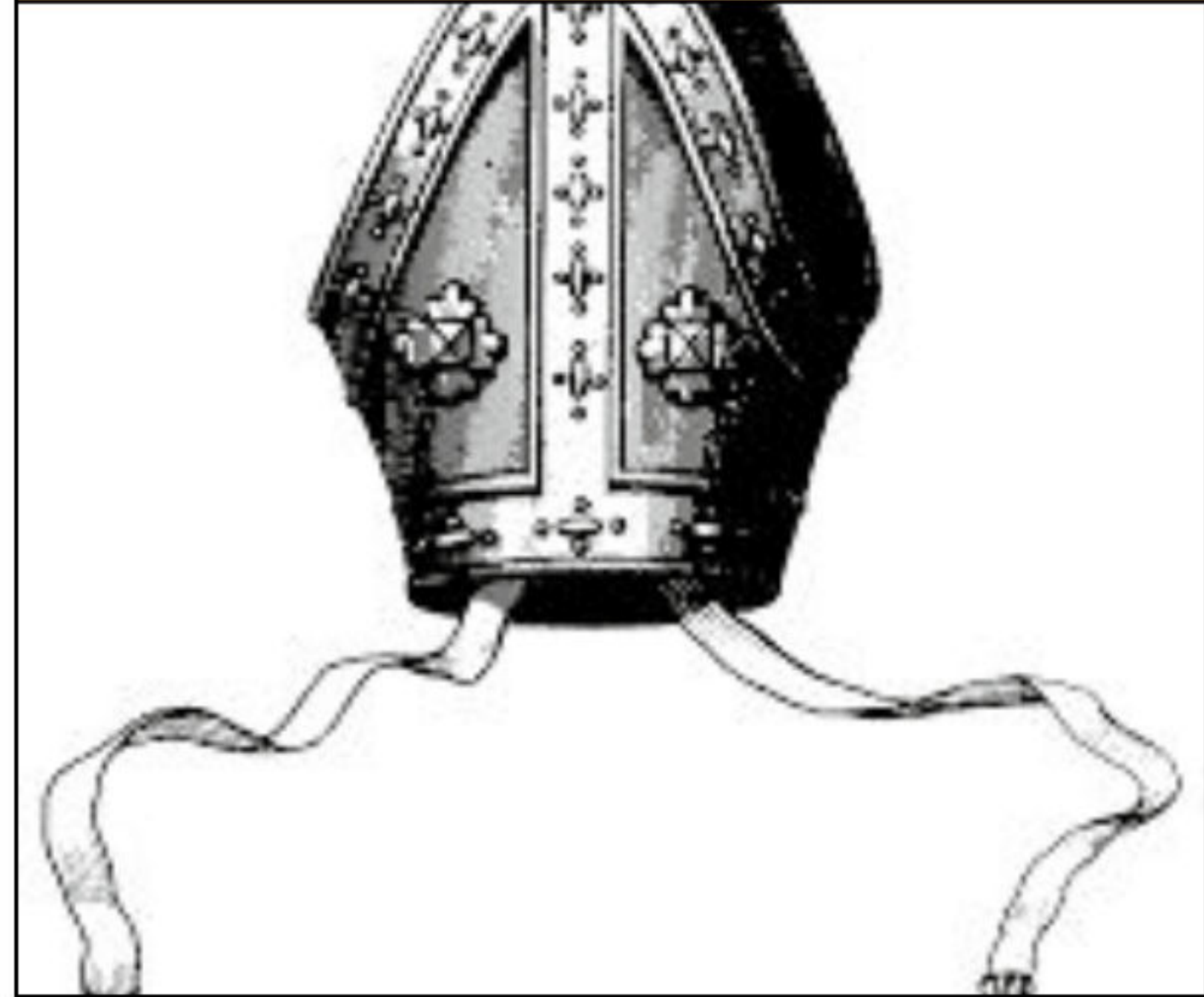
Today is a special day. It is the feast of the chair of Saint Peter the apostle.



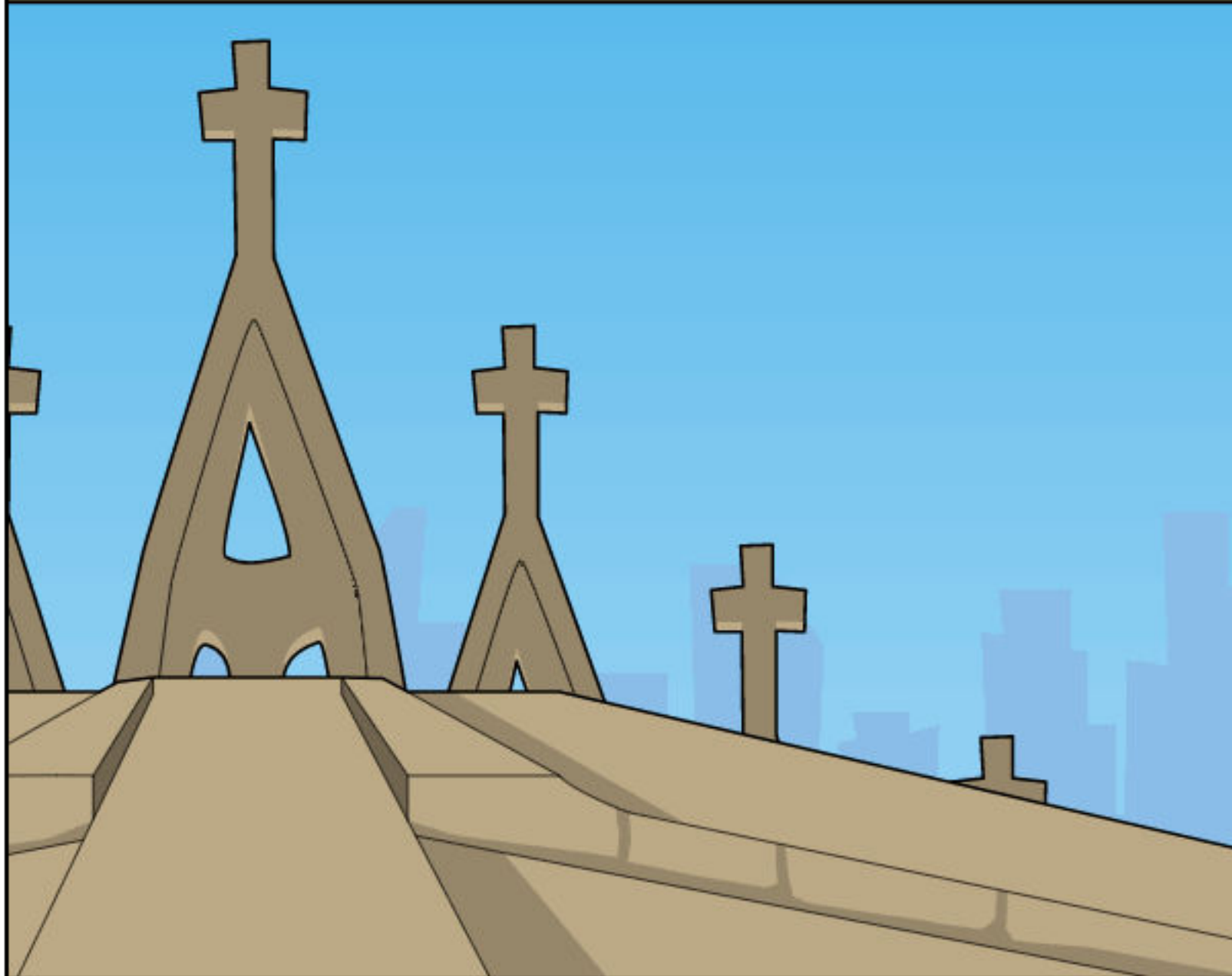
What? Feast of the chair? Are we celebrating some important chair or something :)



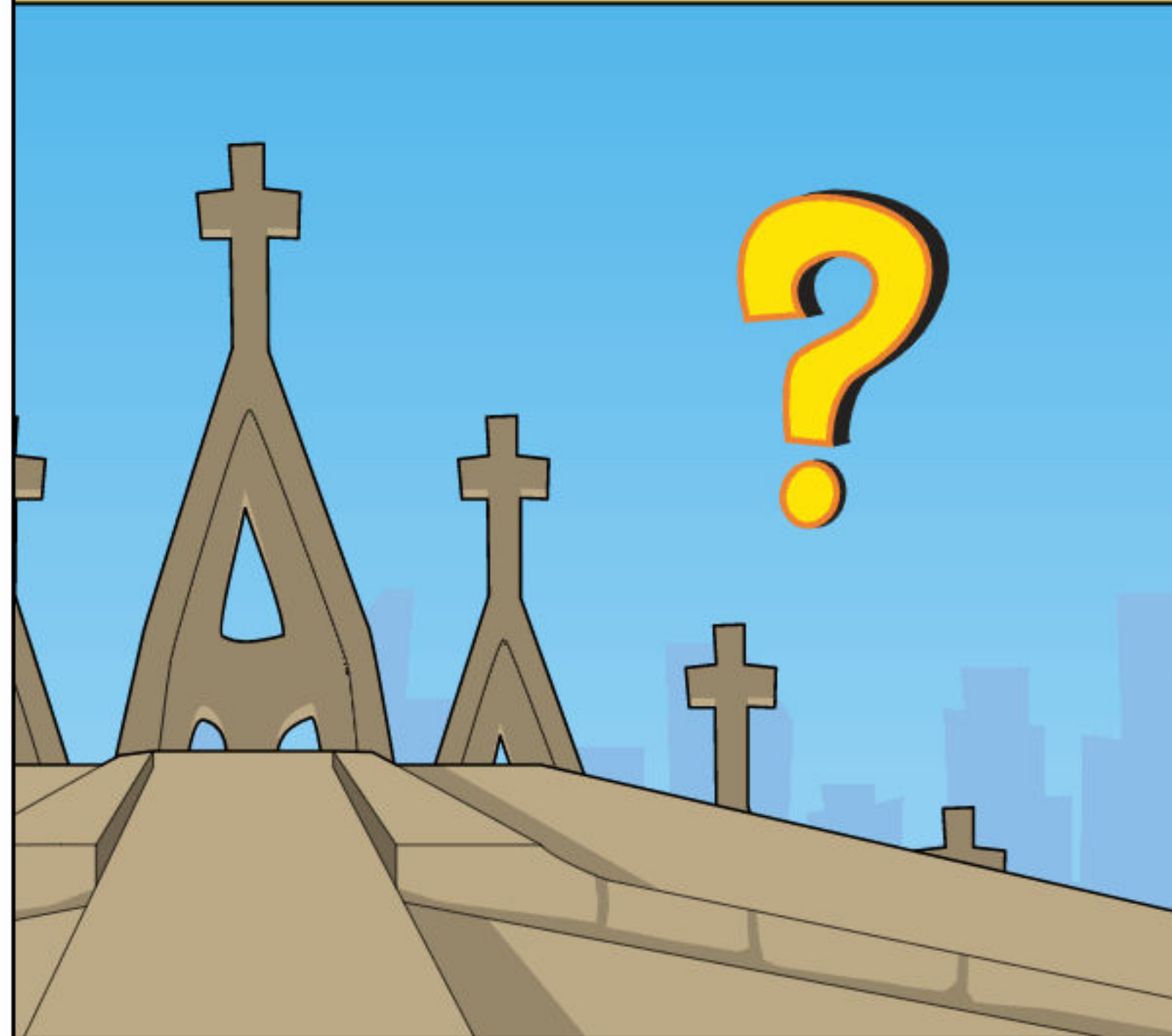
Nope. The chair is symbolic for authority. It means the authority of Peter, the one Jesus made the chief or leader of the 12 apostles.
